Navigating the complexities

of China's regulatory landscape in the rapidly evolving information and communications technology sphere is a unique challenge.

Against the backdrop of an evolving legal system, pervasive and opaque government influence - in which government is often regulator, partner, customer and competitor - and between ministries, state-owned enterprises and entrenched special interest groups, China's government is promulgating programs for development of critical and emerging technology that often treat foreign companies as a short-term source of technology and IP, rather than as long-term partners. Overcoming these challenges requires a thorough understanding of the forces driving the regulatory agenda, and unified, consistent engagement with policy-makers and market regulators.
